Listen My Bridge is So Cool!

Last week, we shared 'listen my bridge is so cool' an alternative story of the '3 Billy Goats Gruff' told by the troll. The children discussed how the troll was kind and described his distinctive features before re telling the story using key phrases and vocabulary such as 'Who's that trip trapping over my bridge' and 'wait for my brother, he's bigger than me'. We are very impressed at their voice choice and acting skills. Throughout the week, the children have built different sized bridges, created potions and painted wonderful representations of the troll.

Oi Frog


This week, we have centred play around our repeated read 'Oi Frog'. The children have enjoyed being outdoors utilising different areas of provision and completing specific challenges as well as devising their own lines of enquiry and play projects. Highlights include rhyming bridges, reading frog jump, building dams along the river and creating potions to transform their friends into various creatures, princesses and monsters. An incredible week of learning!

Art

The children have been experimenting with clay and natural resources this week to create impressions. They learnt how to roll the clay out using rods and rolling pins then press the rosemary, mint and lavender leaves into the clay to create the impression. Over the next few weeks, we intend to develop these skills further to create a James Brunt inspired land art project.



Trip to Meanwood Farm



In Literacy, the children have been learning to re tell stories using story telling language and exciting new vocabulary with their friends. They have also written super sentences to describe the troll in our shared story with beautiful handwriting. This week, we have focussed on orally rehearsing and writing rhyming words and sentences to replicate our favourite rhyming text – Oi Frog! Furthermore, the children have been striving to build sentences using foam bricks and canes and reading them back to check it makes sense.

YEAR 1

Year 1 had a lovely, sun-filled visit to the Yorkshire Wildlife Park on Wednesday; we were so lucky to see lots of creatures very closely, including the polar bears, giraffes, lemurs and the baby rhino! As well as walking around the park, we took part in a polar bear workshop with one of the park teachers. We learnt lots of interesting facts and explored different items too.

In **English** we are working towards writing our own stories, inspired by our core text 'Leaf'. We have been developing our sentence structure, by adding conjunctions to create longer sentences.

In Maths we have been investigating lengths and heights using different objects to measure, including rulers. We have used this skill to start to measure the progress of our seedlings too.

We have been very busy across the curriculum, singing our "Imagination" song in Music, learning about the keypads and trackpads during Computing, exploring printing in Art and continuing to explore our small world and design areas outside in our provision.





The weeks are flying by in the Summer term and Year 2 are enthralled in their new theme 'Whats the weather'. Our visit to Yorkshire Water was an incredible learning opportunity and real-life experience to immerse into our new theme. The children demonstrated their incredible knowledge and were so inquisitive discover even more!

After our amazing visit, Year 2 reflected on their trip to Yorkshire Water by writing a detailed recount. We shared our favourite events using time adverbials, adverbs and exciting vocabulary. This week, we have begun planning and writing our own adventure stories inspired by our core text 'Grandma Bird'.

In Maths, we have continued our new learning on Fractions and have applied our understanding of half, thirds and quarters to find fractions of shapes and amounts. We have loved working with different manipulatives and using iPads to record our learning. With Mrs Longley, we have completed our learning on statistics.

For the Summer term, we are focusing on developing our **athletic skills**. This week, we practiced different jumps in the sunshine!

In Art, we have continued exploring our focus artist, William Turner. Inspired by his artwork, we applied our sketching techniques and used charcoal to build texture to create stormy weather.

Year 3 are making great progress this summer term, positively reflecting on their work and learning to see how far they have come since September and what they are going to continue improving with.

In **English**, we have been redrafting our persuasive letters linked to our core text of 'Charlotte's Web' to ensure we have included a range persuasive openers and modal verbs. The children have been enjoying using laptops to hot write their letters which has supported their typing skills but has also been a great new way to add and edit their work.


For **Maths**, we have been further our knowledge on fractions from earlier on in spring term. The children have focused on adding and subtracting fractions as well as mastering the steps to find fractions of amounts. They have then been using this knowledge to answer a range of problem-solving questions.

David Hockney has been the inspiration and our artist focus for our Art unit this half term. He is a local artist and the children have been using his landscape drawings and paintings as well as his abstract style to create their own mood boards. They have also explored and experimented with primary, secondary and tertiary colours.

In **PE**, the children have been developing their athletic skills particularly in jumping. They have been practising how far they can jump, different jumping styles and using the hurdles. We have also had a great yoga session this week where the children were able to practise some new partner yoga poses.

In **Geography**, the children have been researching different landmarks in the UK. They have enjoyed this so much some even completed more work at home to show to the class, which I am very proud of.

In Art, we have been exploring printing. Inspired by William Morris, the children sketched different floral patterns and then engraved these onto a polystyrene tile and printed with them. They are very excited to complete their final designs and print onto fabric in a couple of weeks' time.

Space-related!

In **English**, the children have been working hard to create the best piece of writing they have ever created. The focus is to write an engaging adventure story about Space, with the purpose of entertaining our peers. We have thought carefully about how to add suspense and tension to out writing, whilst using ambitious vocabulary. We have spent time rereading and editing our writing to ensure that we are proud of what we are creating.

In **Maths**, we have been learning about angles. We can categorise different types of angles, identify how many degrees are in a right angle, straight line, or full turn, and find missing angles. We are now learning to measure angles accurately using a protractor.

Our PE focus this week was jumping. We practised the long jump, vertical jump, triple jump, and speed bounce. We worked in teams and carefully considered how best to perform the different jumps.

In Art, we have created mood boards focusing on the artist Max Ernst. We studied the types of colours he uses in his surrealist pieces and linked this to our learning on Space. We are excited to create our own landscapes in the form of a collage.

In **Computing**, we have continued to develop our adventure game. This week, we learnt how to create hyperlinks to allow players to move from one setting to another.

YEAR 6




