Subject: RE Year Group: 1 Term: Spring "Who is a Muslim and what do they believe?"

Core Learning of This Unit:

- Talk about the fact that Muslims believe in God (Allah) and follow the example of the Prophet Muhammad.
- Identify some ways Muslims mark Ramadan and celebrate Eid-ul-Fitr
- Recognise that Muslims do not draw Allah or the Prophet, but use calligraphy to say what God is like
- Re-tell a story about the life of the Prophet Muhammad
- Recognise some objects used by Muslims and suggest why they are important
- Identify some ways Muslims mark Ramadan and celebrate Eid-ul-Fitr and how this might make them feel.
- Find out about and respond with ideas to examples of cooperation between people who are different.

Prior Learning:

They will have explored past and present events and how children don't always enjoy the same things.

They identify similarities between themselves families, communities and traditions.

National Curriculum Statements:

By the end of KS1 pupils should have been taught to:

- Retell and suggest meanings to some religious and moral stories, exploring and discussing sacred writings and sources of wisdom and recognising the traditions from which they come.
- Observe and recount different ways of expressing identity and belonging, responding sensitively for themselves.
- Find out about and respond with ideas to examples of cooperation between people who are different.
- Recognise some different symbols and actions which express a community's way of life, appreciating some similarities between communities.
- Notice and respond sensitively to some similarities between different religions and worldviews.
- Find out about questions of right and wrong and begin to express their ideas.

Key Vocabulary:

Islam - the religious faith of Muslims including belief in Allah as the only God and as Muhammad as his Prophet.

Qur'an - the holy book for Islam.

Mosque - Muslim place of worship.

Allah - who Muslims believe to be the one God.

Imam - a person who leads prayers in a mosque.

Prophet Muhammad - the messenger of Allah.

Prayer - words that you say to God giving thanks or asking for help
