Subject: RE Year Group: 2 Term: Spring "Who is a Christian and what do they believe?"


Core Learning of This Unit:

- Talk about the fact that Christians believe in God and follow the example of Jesus
- Recognise some Christian symbols and images used to express ideas about God
- Talk about some simple ideas about Christian beliefs about God and Jesus
- Re-tell a story that shows what Christians might think about God, in words, drama and pictures, suggesting what it means.
- Talk about issues of good and bad, right and wrong arising from the stories.
- Ask some questions about believing in God and offer some ideas of their own.
- Make links between what Jesus taught and what Christians believe and do.

Prior Learning:

In Year 1 children will have learnt about the creation story and what makes places sacred.

They will have looked at a Christian place of worship and some significant objects within this.



National Curriculum Statements:

By the end of KS1 pupils should have been taught to:

- Retell and suggest meanings to some religious and moral stories, exploring and discussing sacred writings and sources of wisdom and recognising the traditions from which they come.
- Observe and recount different ways of expressing identity and belonging, responding sensitively for themselves.
- Find out about and respond with ideas to examples of cooperation between people who are different.
- Recognise some different symbols and actions which express a community's way of life, appreciating some similarities between communities.
- Notice and respond sensitively to some similarities between different religions and worldviews.
- Find out about questions of right and wrong and begin to express their ideas.

Key Vocabulary:

Christianity - the religious faith of Christians including belief in God and Jesus.

Church - a building in where Christians worship.

God - the being or spirit that is worshipped and is believed to have created the universe.

Jesus - Christians believe is the son of God.

Bible - the holy book of Christians.

Crucifix - a cross with the figure of Jesus Christ on it

Font - a large stone bowl in a church that holds water for a baptism.

Parable - a short, simple story that teaches a religious idea.

Significant Individuals/Texts

St Paul - Influential early Christian. The letters of St Paul form a significant part of the New Testament. He is responsible for the growth and development of Christianity as a modern religion.
