Snail and the Whale

Last week, we read 'The Snail and the Whale' and enjoyed learning key phrases and vocabulary as well as re telling the story. We used chalk to draw different parts of the story on the playground. What a wonderful 'snail trail' depicting the main events!

We are looking forward to sports day and continuing our transition activities with Miss Harling to prepare children for year 1. We are so proud of all the children and their brilliant attitudes towards learning. An excellent week.

YEAR 1

A lovely sunny end to the fortnight in Year 1; we were amazed at the difference in the weather as the seasons changed from Spring to Summer, highlighting our **Science** learning this

year. The rain we caught in Spring really helped us to evaluate that there was a lot of rain in Spring

this year!

It was empowering to see the children share their animal stories so proudly with friends and family during Library time last week; we had worked incredibly hard in English, Art and

Computing, with illustrations

done on the Paint programme as well! We have now started our new English learning, we are striving to complete a non-chronological report about a jungle animal. During **Geography**, we are learning about where jungles are in the world, and have started to research the Amazon.

We have been incredibly busy in **Maths**, completing our learning on Fractions and learning about how many days are in each month. Please help your child by asking them questions about this at home. We have also started telling the time using o'clock and half past.

During **PSHE**, we have been learning all about Staying Safe on the Road. We have discovered the names of the different crossings: zebra, toucan, puffin and pelican and shared key information on a poster.

YEAR 2

The weeks are truly whizzing by in Year Two's and as we continue to make more magical memories, we are also looking ahead to our transition to Year 3! We are also looking forward to sharing our celebration assembly with you so that we can share our learning journey and favourite memories from Year 2!

We started this week with a fabulous

outdoor learning day in the sunshine!

Throughout the day we used our outdoor
learning to deepen and extend our learning on
our summer term theme 'What's the weather'.

From creating large scale contents to explore
different climates, fire lighting to creating cloud
spotters and identifying types of clouds. Who
knew there were so many different types of
clouds!? It was such a fantastic day to extend
our theme learning. To continue our theme, in
DT, we have been practicing our running stitch
to create weather symbols through sewing.

It has also been brilliant to see Year Two's perseverance in Maths. We are continuing our learning on time and we are now focusing on 5-minute intervals. As we become experts of 5-minute intervals past the hour, we will also begin 5-minute intervals towards the hour. The whole team are now very helpful at being prompt for timings with our timetable!

As we move towards the end of the year, we have had a huge drive on extending our fluency and stamina in our **reading**. During our reading lessons, we have begun reading more challenging, longer texts and developing our inference skills too. To further support, please can you support us with reading with your child at home every day to support with fluency, which is key as we transition into KS2.

With only three weeks left, Year 3 are determined to prove that they are ready for Year 4! They are looking forward to their transition afternoon as well as their celebration assembly to parents in our final week!

In Maths, we have finished our topic on time where we have focused on duration and converting between minutes and seconds in our last lessons. We have now recapped our learning of shape from Year 2 and have focussed upon turns and angles. We completed an outdoor learning lesson where we followed a series of instructions to reinforce our understanding of turns.

For **English**, we have created a character description of Fantastic Mr Fox and peer assessed these to improve our writing. We used detailed critique sheets where we could provide specific suggestions to each other and published our writing in the form of a wanted poster.


