
We would like to thank staff members who will be leaving our trust this week for their dedication and hard work. It is always sad to lose dedicated members; however, we wish them lots of luck for their future.








### 5. Our curriculum and school experience.

Our high aspirations for each Townville child's potential align perfectly with Accomplish's vision. This marks the beginning of something truly special for Townville, our community, and every young learner.




## 2. Growing as a reading school.
