RECEPTION

Our Learning in Reception Class

Over the first two weeks, we have been establishing friendships, routines and exploring our environment. Our theme this half term is 'Marvellous Me' and we started this week by introducing our story 'Owl Babies'. The children have enjoyed re telling the story in the small world area and relating to their feelings leaving their families in school too.

The children have loved using our indoor and outdoor provision to share all about themselves. They have created a portrait of themselves, role play areas and have loved our large-scale construction area to build houses and villages.

Throughout the two weeks, the children have been developing play projects in our indoor and outdoor provision. They have particularly enjoyed building in the sand and construction areas and painting. The role-play and playdough areas still remain popular choices.







This week, we started our Read Write Inc. Phonics sessions and establishing all of the key routines involved. So far, we have taught all the picture cards for all initial set 1 letters (a-z). We have also begun our Fred Games, using 'Fred talk', to begin oral blending. Fred talk is speaking in individual sounds 'm-a-t' to help children hear these sound in words. This is something we have begun doing throughout the day in our talk with children.

In our Library times, we will be sharing with your regular updates of our phonics learning journey and how you can support at home too.

Throughout the week, we have also been concentrating on recognising and writing our name.

Reception Baseline Assessment

The RBA is a short, interactive and practical assessment of your child's early literacy, communication, language and mathematics skills when they begin school, using materials that most children of your child's age will be familiar with. We will be completing this over the next few weeks.

What a lovely start to the new year! Year 1 have settled in well to their new routines and have enjoyed lots of learning both inside and outside the classroom, getting used to their new environment.

The arrival of a special book and lots of dragon eggs has stimulated our work in **English**, we have been using adjectives of colours and shapes to describe the eggs carefully. In Art, we have practised using sketching pencils to sketch the shape of the eggs carefully to show the details and cracks.

In Maths we have been looking at different ways we can represent and write numbers 1 to 10 including on ten frames and on a number line, as well as practising writing the words.

We have been learning all about where we live in Geography. We have learned the village, city and country we live in.

In Science, we have started our learning on Materials; we learned the names of different materials and thought of careful ways to describe them to a friend.



KEY DATES

Friday 18th October - Pontefract castle visit



What a brilliant start to the year we have had in Year Two! We have settled well into our new routines and have been striving high with our expectations. They have enjoyed the introduction of our first theme 'Magnificent Miners' and are excited to continue strengthening their knowledge on our trip next week.

This week we have shared our first repeated read 'Ravi's Roar' and enjoyed exploring key phrases from the text and times when we have felt similar to Ravi.

In **English**, we have begun exploring our core text 'Town is by the sea' for our mining theme. We have used our reading skills to make predictions while creating story maps to help us explore the structure of the story.

In Maths, Year 2 have demonstrated fantastic place value skills. We have explored 2-digit numbers and partitioned them into tens and ones using partitioning, working both practically with concrete resources and moving towards writing number sentences.

We have also begun our **History** learning, exploring key dates in mining and using our knowledge on chronology to label these onto a timeline. We then had a very special delivery from the Coal Mining Museum, where we received a range of artefacts to investigate and explore!

KEY DATES

Thursday 19th September National Coal Mining trip



Year 3 have started the new academic year incredibly well! Now as part of Key Stage Two, the children have settled really brilliantly into routines and have been showcasing an incredible work ethic across subjects. They have enjoyed the introduction of our first theme 'The Lost World' and are excited to continue strengthening their knowledge on this.

In **English**, we have introduced our core text of 'Fossil' by Bill Thomson where the children have been using their own imaginations, facial expressions and body language from the pictures to piece together the story. We have focussed on the build-up and climax of the story, making a plan of what we want to include in our writing. We have been striving to include exciting fronted adverbials, expanded noun phrases and past tense verbs as we start out writing this week.

For Maths, we have been building on the children's place value knowledge from Year 2 and have introduced hundreds to make 3-digit numbers. The children have loved using a range of practical resources to represent 3-digit numbers as well as partitioning numbers flexibly.

In **History**, we introduced our topic of Prehistoric Britain by working as a team to make a huge class timeline! We identified key time periods that we will be focussing on throughout the year and discussed where we would place these onto out timeline and why.

To link in with our learning on fossils, we have created observational drawings of ammonites in **Art**. We are looking forward to exploring our new artist and creating our final 3D pieces linked to ammonites.

YEAR 4

What a fantastic start to the year we have had in Year 4! The children have begun the year with such a positive and eager attitude which has resulted in a successful start! We are so impressed with their enthusiasm and we are excited for a fantastic year!

In Maths, we have started our unit of Place Value and the children have worked hard to write numbers to 1000 as well as partitioning using different concrete resources.

In **English**, we have worked hard on creating character descriptions based on the text 'The Iron Man'. The children have impressed us with their incredible vocabulary including adjectives and adverbs.

We began our **History** learning by recapping what we already know about different time periods. The children were fantastic with their retrieval and used their timelines to showcase their knowledge.

We have loved starting our new learning in Art of creating our own Greek Masks. This week we created our own mood boards inspired by our focus artist Jacob Everett. We used his elliptical technique to recreate his artwork and give facts about him.

In PE, we enjoyed starting to learn skills of invasion games. We spent the first session identifying space and working as a team to complete different activities.

We have been thoroughly impressed with how quickly Year 5 have settled back into school.


We have enjoyed learning about WW2 in our theme, 'The Great Divide'. Year 5's curiosity about the theme has shone. Retuning back to school, Year 5 are working hard on their presentation skills. They have particularly shone in Maths – we look forward to seeing this continue to develop.

In **English**, we have been learning to write descriptive settings. Year 5 have included similes, metaphors, personification, alliteration and an abundance of adjectives in their writing.

In Maths, we have been developing our knowledge of place value. We have mastered comparing and ordering numbers up to 1 million. We've practiced writing 6-digit numbers in both numeral and word form, and have even developed our skills at reading them aloud with confidence.

In Art, Year 5 has been inspired by the life and work of Henry Moore. They have explored his War collection and learned about his creative process. This has helped them to develop their own artistic ideas and create moodboards that reflect their understanding of colour.

In **PE**, they have honed their rugby skills, focusing on agility and teamwork. Through fun and engaging activities, they have developed their ability to pass and dodge. Their teamwork and sportsmanship have been exemplary.

YEAR 6

Year 6 have had a great start to the year - we have been working hard to learn about Ancient Egypt in our new theme 'Treasures'. We were staggered by how long ago the Ancient Egyptian civilization was and have been delving deeper into their beliefs about mummification and gods!


In Maths, we have been refining our skills in place value and the four operations. Regularly practicing our times tables will really support us when we come to mastering multiplication, division and fractions! We can use Timers Table Rock Stars, Diamond Dash or other ways to practice this at home.

In **reading**, we have started to explore our class book 'The Lion Above The Door'. We have asked questions and created predictions about the next chapter. We are also reading 'Secrets of a SunKing' at the end of each day.

In **PSHE**, we have been learning abut rules and routines and have made a fantastic start with our JLT roles - keep it up!
