'Whatever next!'

Last week, we read our new core text 'Whatever next!' by Jill Murphy. After sharing our new story, we were hooked by the exciting journey and practiced key phrases too. We started the week inspired to construct our own rockets and begin our adventure to the moon. As a team, we created picnics, constructed vehicles and explored all around space.



Following our interest in Space and Science, we followed our inquisitiveness with investigations and became scientists. Throughout the week, we have predicted, investigated and explored colour combinations, while also creating different textures. After creating secondary colours, the children have loved using a variety of techniques and movements to drip, splatter and spray our paint.

In Maths, we are learning all about recognising and counting numbers to 10. Through songs, stories and a range of resources in our play, we have been counting forwards to 10 and beginning to recognise number formation too. Our sketchbooks in Art have been a joy to experiment in; over the last couple of weeks we've experimented with mixing, and applying different techniques using the watercolour paints.

In **PSHE**, we have been developing our understanding of different emotions. This week we have considered jealousy and different scenarios and experiences we have personally had.

During Geography we are learning about where we live. We have started this unit by learning about our village, city and country and creating posters of Wrenthorpe.

YEAR 2

Year 2 have continued to settle into new routines and expectations – we are working hard to become independent, striving learners!

In Maths, we have extended our learning on place value and applied our knowledge of tens and ones when labelling number lines and challenged ourselves to even estimate on a number line.

In **English**, we have been striving to develop our vocabulary and adjectives to create a detailed description for the reader. After receiving a concerning letter from the mine, we are creating descriptive posters to help find missing miner, lan!

For our current Art project, we have explored mixing paint to create tones inspired by 'Valerie Ganz'.

YEAR 3

The weeks are flying by in Year 3 and the children are demonstrating a fantastic level of drive, enthusiasm and inquisitiveness with our current topic of 'The Lost World.'

Year 3 enjoyed the opportunity to bring learning outside as part of our outdoor learning day. We explored different types of rocks, how they were formed and where they came from. The most exciting part of the day was our geode hunt! We searched for geodes around the field and cracked them open to find crystals inside. It was amazing to think that we were the first ever humans to see inside each of the rocks.

In **English**, we have been compiling all of our learning and writing skills to create our third person narratives based on our core text 'Fossil' by Bill Thomson. We have taken such a care and pride when publishing our work and we cannot wait to see this on display in the coming weeks.

In Maths, we have shown a fantastic understanding of place value when working with 3-digit numbers in a range of contexts. We are excited to be moving on to addition and subtraction where we have already been showcasing our mental arithmetic skills as well as written methods.

As part of our **History** and **Science** learning on fossils, we have been learning about Mary Anning and the incredible fossils she discovered on the cliffs in Dorset! We are excited to find out more about her in English next week as we start our chronological report writing.

In **Geography**, we have used atlases and Digi maps to explore longitude and latitude. We are learning all about human and physical Geography relating to the UK and our local area.





In Maths, we are mastering using place value grids and partitioning numbers flexibly to 10,000. The children were fantastic at offering different solutions and worked practically together to recall their learning as well as help others.

In **English**, we have began our learning all about Greek Myths. The children have amazed me with their brilliant vocabulary as well as their ideas of their own myth. We are very excited to write these in the coming weeks.

We had a great Outdoor Learning Day with Eden's forest focusing on our history theme of the Ancient Greeks. The children created a timeline of the Greeks, looked at their architecture and created their own buildings looking at the columns as a feature and then ended the afternoon creating their own mythical beast. The children had the best time and Kaye and Adam couldn't be happier with their brilliant manners and exemplary behaviour.

YEAR 5

Year 5 has been making great strides in their learning this term. They've been working diligently and enthusiastically, particularly in their exploration of World War 2. The children have been diving deep into the subject, demonstrating a keen interest and understanding of the historical events.

In Maths, we have been developing our understanding of place value. By understanding how numbers are composed, we've been able to confidently partition larger numbers. We are now focusing on rounding numbers to the nearest 10, 100 and 1000. Year 5 has embraced this challenge with enthusiasm, demonstrating a growing understanding of this essential mathematical skill. Our outdoor learning activities have provided a fun and engaging way to reinforce these concepts.

In **English**, we are studying the features of a Newspaper Report. We are learning how to include direct and reported speech into our writing to enhance our reports.







In **Writing** lessons, we have been writing our own instructions on how to mummify and ancient Egyptian and are now exploring how to write a gripping opening of an action story. We have trialled using different

sentence starters and will be looking at how we can use speech to make the story more exciting.

In Art, we have been using Edward Munch's 'The Scream' for inspiration. We have been looking at the colours and emotions used and have been designing our own backgrounds and final pieces, expressing our chosen emotions and expressions.

In **History**, we have learnt about Howard Carter's discovery of Tutankhamun's tomb and the importance of this in understanding more about the ancient Egyptians.


