Our focus in Reception over the past 2 weeks has been traditional tales with our core text being Little Red Riding Hood. Through our core text, we have developed our confidence and ability within story telling through the repeated phrases in the book – 'and I'll huff and I'll puff and I'll blow your house down!'.


In our role play area, we have had the opportunity to re-tell the story of Little Red Riding Hood with ourselves as the characters! We have taken on those roles very capably!

Continuing our love of traditional tales, some children have started to create the homes of the **Three Little Pigs** within our construction area and we have explored patterns in pathways from this learning.

We have started observing leaves and have been practising observational drawing, following patterns, spotting shapes and mixing water colours to find the correct shade!







YEAR 1


We are really impressed by the children's efforts to be 1% better already this half term and how well they have immersed themselves into their learning since the break!


In **English**, we have been publishing our story book 'The Castle Dragon' – for this we have invented and planned the characters, setting, problem and solution, inspired by our class visit to Pontefract castle. We are excited to share these with Reception class soon!

We have been learning how to write accurate addition number sentences in **Maths**. We have been striving to complete fact families, by swapping around the parts and wholes. Also, we have been persevering to work systematically using ten frames and counters to create all the number bonds to a given number.

In Geography we have been using different information sources so that we can find out more about our capital city:
London. We have identified some of the main landmarks in London and we have enjoyed exploring
London further in our construction and DT areas outside.

Our **History** learning has developed into a specific focus on the monarchy now. This week we have learned about our current monarch: King Charles III!

In English, we have completed our publishing on 'Town is by the Sea' and are so excited to share these with you! This week, we have begun to explore features of a non-chronological report and explain why certain features are important.



We have had another fantastic week in Year 5 and it has been a great start to the half term!



YEAR 5

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
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

Be an Accomplish Governor at one of our schools

We are currently looking for new local governors to join our friendly local governing bodies in our Accomplish Schools. Our current schools are:

- Jerry Clay Academy, Wrenthorpe, Wakefield
- Stanley Grove Academy, Stanley, Wakefield
- Townville Academy, Castleford

Our governors come from a range of different backgrounds, skills and experience but all share a common interest of wanting the best possible education for the children in our schools. Governors are essential for the effectiveness and success of the school and it is an extremely rewarding and fulfilling role. All local school Governors serve a 2 year term. They act as a 'critical friend', working voluntarily to strategically oversee the running of the school.

We would be delighted to hear from anyone who:

- Is interested in children's education and the performance of our schools
- Is community spirited and would like to represent the community
- Has spare time and the energy for the role
- Is able to work well as part of a team
- Has an enquiring mind and the confidence to ask questions and debate issues that affect the school
- Can consider matters objectively and make informed judgements

These volunteer positions are open to parents/ guardians or other people from our community. Co-opted governors are not elected by a parent election but are instead appointed directly by the governing body.

What is the role of the governing body?

- Helping to set and review the schools strategic direction and agreeing targets for improvement
- Holding the headteacher and school leaders to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils

What does the role offer?

- A chance to develop your own personal skills
- Access to a programme of free training in respect of education/governance matters
- A sense of achievement in helping make a difference to children reaching their potential
- The support and guidance from fellow governors

In looking to fill these vacancies we are particularly interested in applications from people with education experience and also people who can occasionally visit the school during the day, although please do not be put off if you do not have these skills. What is more important is enthusiasm, interest and the willingness to learn.

The Pupil Premium is extra government money which is paid to schools to support children's learning and development. We can support you in finding out if your child could receive the extra money. We can choose how to best spend the Pupil Premium money and will work with you to make sure your child benefits from the extra funding.

Who could benefit from this money?

Children from the reception year to year 6 may be eligible if they:

- are registered for Free School Meals (FSM)
- have been registered for FSM at any point in the last 6 years
- are or have been in care
- have parents in the armed forces *If your child could claim for FSM but takes a packed lunch to school, it's still important you tell us. This will let us know if your child is able to receive the Pupil Premium.

Your child could benefit from:

- exciting new learning activities and experiences
- one to one or small group sessions
- extra tools, materials and equipment to help with learning in school or at home
- before/after school clubs or activities

Why should I register my child for Free School Meals (FSM)?

Children who are registered for Free School Meals (FSM) are entitled to the Pupil Premium. Your child isn't automatically registered for FSM, even though all infant children are entitled to receive a free school meal.
