As you know as a school we continue to focus on excellent attendance as this is essential for children to make the best progress. As a whole school we have set a target for the year of **97.4%**



The weeks are flying by in Reception and the children are enthralled in all their learning. They are developing their own interests and play projects and are sustaining these for longer periods of time. We have been challenging ourselves to choose different areas to learn, both inside and outside. Our learner trait focus has been teamwork – doing things together. They have created murals together, tidied together and invited new friends into their play together.

Into the woods

For this half term, our choosing is focused around our theme 'Into the woods'. Last week we shared our focus text 'The three little pigs'. The children enjoyed creating houses out of straw and becoming in role of the pigs and the wolf. They also noticed connections of similarities between 'the three little pigs' and our last text 'Little Red Riding Hood'.

On Monday, Reception had an exciting adventure. We followed a trail of breadcrumbs to discover our new story 'Hansel and Gretel'. Our creative area has been very popular, with children busy creating collage treats to create our very own ginger bread house. We have also been using torches to help Willow the witch to rescue different visitors in the gingerbread house. The children used torches to search and their fred fingers to write and save the visitors.

PE

In P.E, we have used the parachute to create games for our 'into the woods' stories. We loved working as a team and in role as Hansel, Gretel and Willow the witch.

RECEPTION

Phonics

Reception are continuing to shine with their phonics. Our focus this week is to ensure we know all our set 1 single letter sounds and practice our Fred talk for blending. For daily reading at home, please continue to review sounds and use Fred talk around the house e.g ''It's time for the b-a-th''. ''we need to go to the sh-o-p''

This week, we have changed sound blending books and will be sending links to the phonics films via Parentmail on Thursday.

Each week, we aim to read with the children and change books on a Tuesday and Thursday. Please ensure your child brings their reading folder to school every day with their blue reading diary and sound blending book.

Christmas Activity Morning

We are so excited to share a magical morning of Christmas crafts with you on Friday 6th December. It will start at 9:15am and will last approximately an hour.

Nativity

As we shared with you in library time, our rehearsals for our first JCA nativity have started and we are learning songs and the story. To help us learn our parts to say, we have sent home their sentences. If you help practice saying their part in a loud voice, we would really appreciate your support!





In **Englis**h we have been striving with describing dragons using prepositions and verbs vocabulary. We have enjoyed going on a dragon hunt and then we took our own dragon on an adventure, next we are striving to create our own maps in Geography to further inspire our writing.

During our **Maths** lessons, we have been learning about number sentences and number bonds to 10. We have also started to learn about subtraction.

We have loved learning about Queen Elizabeth II and Queen Victoria in our **History** lessons, and in **Geography** we have been busy routeplanning; we used maps of Wrenthorpe to plan our walking route to St Anne's church, which we visited on Tuesday! At the church, we went on a treasure hunt to find all the special objects.



Wow! The weeks really are passing by so quickly as we excitedly approach December! This week, we will begin practicing for our **Christmas Nativity**, we can't wait to share it with you!

In **English**, we have started creating our non-chronological report on mining. Last week, we focussed on subtitles and how to organise our sentences into paragraphs. This week we have started constructing our paragraphs. We have used a variety of facts to create an introduction and paragraph on mining jobs with fantastic questions and conjunctions.

In **Maths**, we have worked so incredibly hard with our exchanging skills for the column method! Particularly when subtracting with exchanging, we have utilised the steps to success on the working wall to become even more accurate with our working.

We have started our DT project for this half term and we are looking forward to making our own miners snap tin pasties. We have investigated our design brief as well as designing what fillings we want to include inside our pasties.

In RE, we have completed our end of unit assessment looking at the importance of belonging. We created leaflets to explain how different religions showcase belonging in a variety of ways. We focussed on using tier 3 vocabulary to explain our understanding.

YEAR 3

Year 3 are continuing to shine and work incredibly hard through the autumn term - really focussing on themselves and how they can continue to get better every day.

In Maths, we continue to explore multiplication and division. In particular, we have been mastering our three times tables, spotting patterns and using the inverse to find missing numbers. We have really enjoyed taking part in a range of activities to help us remember our 3's and applying our knowledge to worded problems.

In **English**, we were introduced to our core text of 'Stone Age Boy' and used clues from the front cover and our inquirer trait to make predictions about the text. We have also sequenced key events and written our own captions to these to help us begin to use ambitious and powerful vocabulary.

For **PE**, we have really been enjoying our focus on balancing, travelling and jumps in

gymnastics! Each week we have been building on our skills and using feedback from others to improve our routines. We have strived to include a

have strived to include a range of point balances and discussed the best way to transition

between these.

In Geography,

we looked at the Jurassic and Yorkshire coast and used different colours of card to represent the layers of rock that make up these coast lines.





We have had a brilliant couple of weeks in year four.
The children have impressed us with their fantastic
history knowledge on their trip to the Royal
Armouries as well as in their History lessons.

At the Royal Armouries, the children were immersed in their learning of the Anglo-Saxons by watching a combat between the Vikings and the Saxons. They also reenacted the story of Beowulf and they were even archaeologists excavating a burial site, learning all about the different artefacts and how they were linked to the Anglo-Saxons. The children loved this day and showed brilliant behaviour and inquisitiveness!

In **Maths** we have been learning all of our times tables. The children have enjoyed recapping the different times tables as well as applying this knowledge into different reasoning and problemsolving questions. They have also enjoyed learning songs to go with each times table.

In **English**, we have used our History knowledge to create our own letters based in the Anglo-Saxon time period. We have tried to persuade people to visit England because of the great things they had to offer at the time - the children have worked hard to include time adverbials, powerful adjectives and factual information.



YEAR 6

Year 6 are continuing to strive hard each week – we are so proud of how hard they are working!

In Maths, we have been learning about how to calculate with fractions and have successfully added, subtracted, multiplied and divided these. In the next couple of weeks, we will send home an updated version of the 'arithmetic methods support booklet' to assist children with their revision and homework and remember the methods that they have learnt.

In **Geography**, we have continued to learn about rivers. Last week, we created our own river models and used our oracy skills to explain how these work. We also took part in a fantastic workshop with Yorkshire Water, learning how technology is used to clean rivers and blockages. We built and programmed Lego robots to simulate this.

We also enjoyed a brilliant **Parent Workshop**– sharing our History and Curriculum learning with all of you – thank you for making this such an enjoyable morning!



Be an Accomplish Governor at one of our schools

We are currently looking for new local governors to join our friendly local governing bodies in our Accomplish Schools. Our current schools are:

- Stanley Grove Academy, Stanley, Wakefield
- Townville Academy, Castleford

Our governors come from a range of different backgrounds, skills and experience but all share a common interest of wanting the best possible education for the children in our schools. Governors are essential for the effectiveness and success of the school and it is an extremely rewarding and fulfilling role. All local school Governors serve a 2 year term. They act as a 'critical friend', working voluntarily to strategically oversee the running of the school.

We would be delighted to hear from anyone who:

- Is interested in children's education and the performance of our schools
- Is community spirited and would like to represent the community
- Has spare time and the energy for the role
- Is able to work well as part of a team
- Has an enquiring mind and the confidence to ask questions and debate issues that affect the school
- Can consider matters objectively and make informed judgements

These volunteer positions are open to parents/ guardians or other people from our community. Co-opted governors are not elected by a parent election but are instead appointed directly by the governing body.

What is the role of the governing body?

- Helping to set and review the schools strategic direction and agreeing targets for improvement
- Holding the headteacher and school leaders to account for the educational performance of the school and its pupils

What does the role offer?

- A chance to develop your own personal skills
- Access to a programme of free training in respect of education/governance matters
- A sense of achievement in helping make a difference to children reaching their potential
- The support and guidance from fellow governors

In looking to fill these vacancies we are particularly interested in applications from people with education experience and also people who can occasionally visit the school during the day, although please do not be put off if you do not have these skills. What is more important is enthusiasm, interest and the willingness to learn.

The Pupil Premium is extra government money which is paid to schools to support children's learning and development. We can support you in finding out if your child could receive the extra money. We can choose how to best spend the Pupil Premium money and will work with you to make sure your child benefits from the extra funding.

Who could benefit from this money?

Children from the reception year to year 6 may be eligible if they:

- are registered for Free School Meals (FSM)
- have been registered for FSM at any point in the last 6 years
- are or have been in care
- have parents in the armed forces *If your child could claim for FSM but takes a packed lunch to school, it's still important you tell us. This will let us know if your child is able to receive the Pupil Premium.

Your child could benefit from:

- exciting new learning activities and experiences
- one to one or small group sessions
- extra tools, materials and equipment to help with learning in school or at home
- before/after school clubs or activities

Why should I register my child for Free School Meals (FSM)?

Children who are registered for Free School Meals (FSM) are entitled to the Pupil Premium. Your child isn't automatically registered for FSM, even though all infant children are entitled to receive a free school meal.
