
In Maths this week, we have been recapping our numbers one to seven and representing them in a variety of ways. Our challenge this week, has been to create Christmas shapes by combing and adding numicon numbers. After rotating and adding to create a shape, we have accurately counted the numbers to find out how many altogether.

Our P.E sessions have been a bundle of fun with the parachute. We have focused on developing large movements and coordination to control the parachute and work as a team. On Wednesday, we had our final yoga session of the Autumn term. These have been an incremental part of our week and we have loved practicing our mindfulness throughout the days too. We will be sending P.E kits home to be refreshed ready for the Spring term.

We know the build up to Christmas can be full of cardboard boxes and deliveries. If you have any spare **boxes** to recycle, we would really appreciate them for our provision and junk modelling.

The weeks are flying by in Year 2 and we cherishing the magical memories we are able to make together during this festive period. We have been rehearsing our nativity 'A Wriggly Nativity' and we are so excited to share this with you next week. We also designed and created our own baubles to decorate our magical JCA Christmas tree!

In **English**, we have been completing our final draft of our non-chronological report ready to hot write and then publish. We have been challenging ourselves to uplevel vocabulary and use a range of conjunctions.

In Maths, we have started our new unit on money. When identifying different coins, we have applied our knowledge of shape and their properties to help us recognize the similarities and differences. Applying our place value and addition skills, we have begun to count and add amounts of coins and notes.

As part of our **DT** project, we have followed a series of instructions to create pastry for our 'tin miner pasties'. It was vital that we followed each step accurately and enjoyed brining our designs to life.

In **Computing**, we have loved our unit on 'games testers!' We have been using the laptops to test a range of games and dig deeper into how they work. We have looked inside each game at the algorithms that make them work.

For the Spring term we will be focussing on our new theme of 'What is Community' and beginning to explore the human and physical characteristics of our local area. We will look at what it means to be part of a community and also compare this to community within the time period of the Vikings.

In Maths, we have finished looking at different times tables and how we can apply these into different word questions. The children used Base 10 to help represent the different times tables and used their knowledge of exchange to explain the different answers.

In **English**, the Children have published their Anglo Saxon letters. They have worked hard to include lots of exciting vocabulary as well as rhetorical questions and fronted adverbials. I am also impressed with how much historical detail they have included in their work, really connecting their learning across subjects.

In **History**, we have been archaeologists excavating the site of Sutton Hoo in East Anglia. We discussed the artefacts we found and what made them significant in figuring out who was buried there.

In DT, the children are well on their way into creating their own pneumatic dragon. The children conducted market research with Year 1 asking them key questions which then helped them with the design process. We cannot wait to make these in the final week.



Year 5 have thoroughly impressed us with their fantastic attitude and motivation to learn.

In Maths, we are focusing on Fractions. We have learnt how to add and subtract fractions with different denominators and the children have shown great resilience on this topic. We have started to learn how to convert improper fractions to mixed numbers and mixed number into improper fractions.

In **English**, we have finished publishing our diaries entries based on our core text, 'The Emergency Zoo.' The children worked hard to included ambitious vocabulary, emotive language and a range of sentence types.

In **DT**, the children have completed creating their Caesar Ciphers – now we can send secret messages!





In Maths, we have continued to learn and


consolidate all of our arithmetic methods and deepen our learning about fractions, decimals and percentages. We will be continuing to learn about fractions, decimals and percentages next half term. Please do have a look over the arithmetic methods booklet and revision guides that were sent home last week - these will support with revision.

In **Reading**, Year 6 have been reading 'A Christmas Carol' and identifying evidence to support characters' personalities. Throughout the term, they have continued to develop their understanding of vocabulary and confidence when reading longer

texts. We will be continuing this next half term and appreciate your support in ensuring that your child continues to read every day! We have also created our own Scrooge character descriptions and read these to each other.

In Geography, we have continued to learn about rivers and have focused on reasons why they flood and why dams are built. We also enjoyed a cooking session with Chef Jane where we prepared, cooked and tasted our Mayan inspired food!

The Pupil Premium is extra government money which is paid to schools to support children's learning and development. We can support you in finding out if your child could receive the extra money. We can choose how to best spend the Pupil Premium money and will work with you to make sure your child benefits from the extra funding.

Who could benefit from this money?

Children from the reception year to year 6 may be eligible if they:

- are registered for Free School Meals (FSM)
- have been registered for FSM at any point in the last 6 years
- are or have been in care
- have parents in the armed forces *If your child could claim for FSM but takes a packed lunch to school, it's still important you tell us. This will let us know if your child is able to receive the Pupil Premium.

Your child could benefit from:

- exciting new learning activities and experiences
- one to one or small group sessions
- extra tools, materials and equipment to help with learning in school or at home
- before/after school clubs or activities

Why should I register my child for Free School Meals (FSM)?

Children who are registered for Free School Meals (FSM) are entitled to the Pupil Premium. Your child isn't automatically registered for FSM, even though all infant children are entitled to receive a free school meal.
