RECEPTION

The weeks are flying by in Reception and the children continue to amaze us with their passion and enthusiasm for learning.

This half term, we have started our new learning focusing on **'under the sea'.** So far, we have loved our core texts, Rainbow Fish' and 'Tiddler'. Reception have shown a keen interest in sea creatures, and we have followed their enquiry through group projects.

Our writing area has been very popular this half term and the children are striving to show their incredible letter formation and spelling. We have been creating story maps to retell the story of 'Tiddler, created sentences about Captain Cooks expedition and even started writing about our characters for world book day! We are striving to use our Fred fingers and action words to help us.

We love a **Maths** challenge. Last week, we were striving with our doubling, and we now know how to double numbers 1 to 5. This week, we have been exploring making two groups and counting how many altogether using stem sentences, part whole models and number sentences.

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RECEPTION

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For this half term, we have a new focus artist, **James Brunt**, a local artist who is a sculptor. He uses natural resources to create circular patterns, and this has inspired our own artwork too! Some children have created James Brunt inspired patterns in the sand area, outside area and even as part of our sea creature projects.

What better way to finish the first two weeks back than celebrating World book Day! The children have been beaming in their costumes and everyone looks incredible. We enjoyed sharing and celebrating our favourite books with each other.

YEAR 1

What a super start to Spring 2 in Year 1; we have been working hard in all aspects of our learning, striving to even be 1% better than last half term!

Our new core text focus is **The Robot** and the **Bluebird**, and we have enjoyed finding out more about the characters and setting of this story. We have acted in role, explored our own scrap heap and worked hard to use adjectives carefully. This story is also full of helpfulness and good friendship which has encouraged us to think more closely about our friendship focus in PSHE.

In Maths, we have been working incredibly hard at using our existing knowledge to grow our Maths brains, this week we have been using our number bonds to 10 to help us to speedily create number bonds to 20 using a "magic ten".

Our **History** learning has centred around Rosa Parks and how she felt she didn't belong in society. We learnt about how her actions

helped the government to change the segregation law!! The children expressed their understanding through drawings and have been so articulate in their views.

YEAR 2

On Monday afternoon, we started our week with a visit to the beautiful **Wakefield Cathedral**.

While exploring the features of the Cathedral, we took part in a workshop to explore the Christian beliefs, signs and symbols to reflect on our Christianity unit in RE. The workshop leaders were really impressed by our knowledge of Christianity and our inquisitiveness to find out even more!

In **Maths**, we have continued our unit on division. After revisiting equal groups and division, we have explored using sharing as a method of division. We worked practically using counters before progressing to drawings for our pictorial representation. In **English**, we created 'Pretty Salma's fruit salad' and have used this to plan and start to our draft our own version of the instructions.

On Wednesday, we had our yoga session which is key for taking time to be mindful and develop our mental wellbeing.

Each day, we have continued to take time to practice mindfulness activities to regulate ourselves and learn to be present, calm and in the moment.

What a fantastic way to finish the week celebrating World Book Day! We had such a special day celebrating the magic of reading, our favourite stories and characters. During the day, we explored our own reading journeys and represented these in our own unique ways.

YEAR 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic start to the new half term! We have introduced our exciting new book, **How** to Train Your Dragon, which has sparked a lot of enthusiasm among the children.

In **maths**, we have been exploring fractions, working hard to understand equivalent fractions while showing great resilience.

Our **computing** lessons have been particularly engaging, as we have been creating videos about different aspects of the Vikings. This project has allowed us to demonstrate excellent teamwork, and we have been clear and confident presenters.

A highlight of this half term so far was our inspiring trip to **Sinai Synagogue**. The children impressed everyone with their knowledge of the Sabbath and were eager to learn even more about Jewish traditions. They had the opportunity to try challah, a special type of bread, and wear a kippah as part of the experience. It was a wonderful trip that deepened our understanding of different cultures and beliefs.

YEAR 4

Year 4 have had a fantastic couple of weeks engrossed in their learning. They have blown me away with their fantastic attitude towards their learning and incredible hard work in their writing.

In Maths, the children have been challenging themselves to convert between mixed number and improper fractions. This has been tricky but they have made themselves proud with their determination to complete the tasks and get the answers right.

In **English**, we have been creating our own story based on the text 'The Explorer' by Katherine Rundell. The children have impressed us so much with their fantastic vocabulary and interesting sentence structures. We are so excited to hot write and publish this next week. In **PE**, the children have enjoyed starting our new unit of Tennis. We have focused on throwing and catching as well using the forehand stroke to aim accurately towards their partner.

World Book Day has been a special day! We have loved seeing the amazing costumes and delving into the fantastic books and characters. We read in the 'weirdest' places and then created our own reading journeys including the best books they have read from their earliest memories to now. It was magical to see!

YEAR 5

Year 5 have had a brilliant couple of weeks of learning and their writing has shone!

Exciting things are happening in **maths**! Year 5 have started a new topic on fractions and are already mastering the skill of multiplying a whole number by a fraction

In **English**, the magic of storytelling has taken hold! We've been immersed in the traditional tale "The Lime Tree's Curse," and the children have truly shone as they've begun crafting their own captivating versions. Their writing is filled with impressive flair and creativity, demonstrating a wonderful understanding of narrative and language. We're so excited to see their stories unfold!

In **Spanish**, we have been recapping numbers 1-20 and developing our knowledge of 20-50. We have enjoyed a game of snakes and ladders with a Spanish twist.

In Art, Year 5 have created fantastic evaluations for their Art pieces. They have explained in detail their choice of colour, who/what influenced them and how they created the mood.

Year 5's World Book Day was absolutely enchanting! We saw a fantastic array of costumes, each representing a cherished character, and the buzz of excitement was amazing.

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YEAR 6

Year 6 have shown an excellent attitude towards their learning in the start to this half term.

In **Maths**, we have been learning about ratio and proportion and have been solving different worded questions involving these.

In **Writing**, we have published our August vlogs and have been learning about persuasion. Year 6 showed some excellent debating skills when role-playing different characters from the story of Wonder.

In **DT** and **Computing**, we shared our micro:bit toys with Year 1 and created our evaluations of our final products.

In **Geography**, we have been learning about how earthquakes and tsunamis link. We created a short documentary explaining this. We have also had a fantastic Outdoor Afternoon. Year 6 have deepened their understanding of volcanoes, earthquakes and tsunamis by re-enacting causes and effects and creating earthquake-proof buildings. Both Adam and Kay from Eden's Forest commented upon how excellent their teamwork skills were, how much they demonstrated their enthusiasm for learning and their polite manners. An absolute credit to Jerry Clay Academy - well done Year 6!

You might be eligible to Pupil Premium. What is the Pupil Premium (PP)?



The Pupil Premium is extra government money which is paid to schools to support children's learning and development. We can support you in finding out if your child could receive the extra money. We can choose how to best spend the Pupil Premium money and will work with you to make sure your child benefits from the extra funding.

Who could benefit from this money?

Children from the reception year to year 6 may be eligible if they:

- are registered for Free School Meals (FSM)
- have been registered for FSM at any point in the last 6 years
- are or have been in care
- have parents in the armed forces * If your child could claim for FSM but takes a packed lunch to school, it's still important you tell us. This will let us know if your child is able to receive the Pupil Premium.

Your child could benefit from:

- exciting new learning activities and experiences
- one to one or small group sessions
- extra tools, materials and equipment to help with learning in school or at home

Why should I register my child for Free School Meals (FSM)?

Children who are registered for Free School Meals (FSM) are entitled to the Pupil Premium. Your child isn't automatically registered for FSM, even though all infant children are entitled to receive a free school meal.
