


Exploring the stories of Paddington and The Robot and the Bluebird has made for an excellent term in Year 1. The children's learning attitudes are continuing to grow and flourish; we have especially appreciated learning more outside the classroom as the weather has improved too! Last week we were even treated to a visit to the

Magical outdoor library to read outside!

In **English**, we have loved drafting and publishing our robot descriptive writing, using adjectives and similes to create a picture for the reader. These look beautiful and will be made into our Year 1 Robot magazine which we will place on our bookshelf.

For the past fortnight, we have been very busy at the **D&T** table. After designing our robots, we have enjoyed making them using the tools and materials. We have been building up to this moment for a few weeks so it has been lovely to observe the excitement!

Year 1 have immersed themselves into the **music theme week** this week. The children enjoyed creating the rhythm of our class song "Round and round" using the language of frogs and tadpoles. We have also enjoyed, and excelled at, composing our own rhythms using our bodies as percussion; we spent time reading each other's and practised performing these too!



In **Maths**, we have started our new unit on 'Mass and Capacity.' We have explored different ways to measure mass in grams and kilograms as well as using scales to compare mass.

For **English**, we were so excited to receive a book delivery all the way from Africa! Sunny the meerkat sent us his book of 'Meerkat Mail' which has inspired our postcard writing. We have recounted our trip of Wakefield Cathedral to help start our planning.

This week, we have loved our **music theme**week. We started the week by learning music
notation and practicing different ways in which we
can clap to a beat. From this, we composed our
own scores to link in with our song 'Music in our
soul.' We trialled our composition pieces and
discussed that we should focus on using two
different ones in our instrumental. Using different
percussion instruments we then performed and
recorded our song. We are so proud of it!

YEAR 3

Year 3 have worked incredibly hard this spring term and are thriving in all aspects of their learning. In Literacy, they have been improving their oracy skills through lively debates on whether animals should be kept in captivity. Their persuasive arguments and confident speaking have been impressive, as well as their turn taking and listening skills.

In maths, the children have been developing their understanding of capacity and volume. Using jugs and water, they have been measuring and counting intervals on a scale, improving their practical and problemsolving skills.

During **Science** lessons, they have been experimenting with light to explore how shadows are formed and how different materials reflect light, making exciting discoveries along the way.

Their enthusiasm extends beyond core subjects as well. In Spanish, they are becoming more fluent with their greetings and colours, showcasing their growing language skills. During DT lessons, the children have been designing and constructing photo frames. The final products were excellent, they used lots of attention to detail when adding final touches.

Music week has been a highlight, where they enjoyed playing the ukulele and composing their own instrumentals to accompany our class song, Can't Stop the Learning. It has been a fantastic term, and we can't wait to see what they achieve next!





What a fantastic half term we have had! It has flown by and the children have demonstrated fantastic learning attitudes throughout the curriculum.

In **English**, we are looking at acrostic poetry to end our amazing unit on the Rainforest. The children have written beautiful vocabulary and are trying to include different technical vocabulary such as alliteration and onomatopoeia.

In Maths, the children have impressed us so much with their knowledge on decimals. They have used place value counters to aid their understanding and have impressed with their reasoning and problem solving.

We were very fortunate to go and visit a Gurdwara last week in Leeds as part of our Sikhism unit in RE. The children showed great respect and enthusiasm for the religion as they were taught how Sikhs prayed, the activities that they do at the Gurdwara and were even lucky enough to try some food which they kindly brought us.

It was brilliant to hear our children's knowledge being applied. This was a fantastic trip which the children enjoyed so much!

The children have enjoyed composing their own music during this **Music Week.** We have been so excited composing our own music and learning about the value of notes and how to write these onto a stave. We are so eager to share our final performance!

YEAR 5

Year 5 have had a busy fortnight, and we have especially enjoyed Music Week!

In **English**, we have been focussing on poetry. We have learnt how to use similes, metaphors, personification and alliteration to make our writing engaging. Our poems are all about a snow forest, inspired by our core text, 'The Girl Who Speaks Bear'.

In Maths, we have been focusing on adding decimals with tenths, hundredths and thousandths. Moving forward, we will strive to find equivalent fractions and decimals.

In **History**, we have been writing essays to showcase all of our fantastic knowledge about the Romans. We then Year 5's enthusiasm and understanding of the Romans have blown us away.

Year 5 have been enjoying their bread unit in **DT**. They particularly enjoyed evaluating existing products. Testing 4 different breads,

we rated them based on taste, smell, texture, size and appearance. We have designed our loafs of bread and are looking forward to making these next term.





In **Writing**, we have written letters in role from the perspective of passengers on the HMT Windrush. These were full of emotion and captured the thoughts of people who were on board – using evidence from previous history lessons.



The Pupil Premium is extra government money which is paid to schools to support children's learning and development. We can support you in finding out if your child could receive the extra money. We can choose how to best spend the Pupil Premium money and will work with you to make sure your child benefits from the extra funding.

Who could benefit from this money?

Children from the reception year to year 6 may be eligible if they:

- are registered for Free School Meals (FSM)
- have been registered for FSM at any point in the last 6 years
- are or have been in care
- have parents in the armed forces *If your child could claim for FSM but takes a packed lunch to school, it's still important you tell us. This will let us know if your child is able to receive the Pupil Premium.

Your child could benefit from:

- exciting new learning activities and experiences
- one to one or small group sessions
- extra tools, materials and equipment to help with learning in school or at home
- before/after school clubs or activities

Why should I register my child for Free School Meals (FSM)?

Children who are registered for Free School Meals (FSM) are entitled to the Pupil Premium. Your child isn't automatically registered for FSM, even though all infant children are entitled to receive a free school meal.
