After an incredible **Creative Arts** week and a restful half term, Reception have returned striving higher than ever for their final half term. This half term we have sparked our new learning from our theme 'miniature worlds' with a focus on minibeast. Following the children's interestest, we have started to investigate minibeast with multiple legs and how something so small can fly, leading to our 'wings' project.

Our core text this week is 'Mad about minibeasts'. The children have loved exploring all types of minibeasts, some more well know and others more obscure. They have started their investigations on different types of minibeasts and have particularly enjoyed constructing their own minibeasts throughout their play.



In Maths, we have created minibeast maths stories to explore addition. Using sentence stems 'first', 'then' and 'next', the children have started to create their own minibeast math stories to represent and write addition

YEAR 1

Year 1 enjoyed a very **creative Arts** week before the half term! We explored the theme "The World through my eyes" as a class, considering who, where and what is important to us. We also enjoyed looking at the work of different artists, creating our own paint brushes like our artist and using similar techniques to them to create a landscape.

In **English**, we have been working on a poem all about our beautiful place. We have edited this so that it is beautiful, using adjectives to describe our place and it is almost ready to showcase at our Creative arts gallery on Wednesday 11th June.

We are all flying with our **phonics** learning at the moment! We are striving with our word challenges, and have been using our reading routine of "Special friends, fred talk, read the word" to support each other during phonics games and provision.

We have enjoyed exploring volume and capacity in **Maths** in our water area outside. We have started to learn about equal groups and arrays this week, to support our understanding of counting in 2s, 5s and 10s, and how this linked to multiplication.

In Maths, we have started our new unit of time! This week, we have developed our understanding of the different hands on the clock to be able to read and draw the time at o'clock and half past. Our knowledge of fractions have helped us with this too!

In **PE**, we have loved practicing for Sports Day! Using the track to practice our races of egg and spoon as well as the three legged race.

We have, of course, also been striving to create our wonderful **Art Gallery** as part of our whole school celebration of 'Branching Out'. It has been key to reconnect with our well-being through Art and we were so proud to be able to share it with you at our Art Gallery!





Year 3 have made a fantastic start to the final half term of the school year, showing real determination and enthusiasm in all areas of learning. The children have returned with positive attitudes and a commitment to doing their very best, which has been wonderful to see.

We've particularly enjoyed exploring our local area, diving into the fascinating **history of Wrenthorpe** and discovering how Potovens got its name. Our learning has taken us back in time as we looked at the village's pottery heritage and the impact it had on the community.

In **English**, we have been busy finalising our poems inspired by Creative Arts Week. The theme, "The World Through Our Eyes," gave the children a chance to express their unique perspectives and creativity through descriptive language and thoughtful imagery. It has been lovely to see the pride they've taken in their work and the powerful messages their poems convey.

We've also been keeping active in P.E, with lots of excitement building as we prepare for sports day. The children have been practising their relay races and the egg and spoon event, showing great teamwork and perseverance.

In maths, our focus has shifted to learning about time. We've begun by revisiting Roman numerals up to 12 and are now learning to tell the time to the nearest five minutes- an important and practical skill. Well done, Year 3, for all your hard work so far!

YEAR 4


What a fantastic first week back we have had! The children have come back eager and ready to learn for our last half term in Year 4!


In **English**, we have discovered our new core text 'Sherlock Holmes' by Sir Arthur Conan Doyle. This has sparked interest in our class and the children are keen to read the other books which have all the cases he has to try and solve.

In **Maths**, the children have developed on their knowledge of decimals to work with money. They have added, subtracted and problem solved to master this unit.

In **History**, tying in with our theme of the term, 'Grand Designs', the children have learned about the invention of canals and their use for trade in the country during the Industrial Revolution. They then discussed and debated who was most impacted, roleplaying different important people from the time.

In Art, we have loved being inspired by our focus artist, William Morris, to create our final designs for our printing. We then practised the skill of using the polystyrene tiles to engrave different floral patterns to ensure our design would look effective when we create our final piece. We are so excited to start creating these next week!





Year 5 shone throughout **Creative Arts** Week! We thought about how we see the world and what is important to us. As a class, we were inspired by the work of David Hockney and were influenced by his artwork when creating our landscapes.

The children have had a great week back and demonstrated an eagerness to dive into our topic, 'A life through a lens'.


In **English**, we have drafted, edited and published our adventure stories set in Space. Moving forward, we are learning the features used in an information text and are keen to create our own. We have also enjoyed our reading lessons, especially working in pairs to annotate the text.

In Maths, we began our 'Statistics' unit. The class have been super excited to start this unit with many of them stating how confident they feel and it is their favourite unit yet! It is great to see children so engaged and enjoying their Maths.

In **Science**, we have been learning about the famous astronomer, Galileo Galilei. We researched his life, discussed the importance of his discoveries and wrote an explanation detailing the impact of his work.

Before the half term, Year 6 embraced our Creative Arts Week exploring our theme "The World through my eyes." We thought carefully about things in our lives that are important to us and how we could express and include these in a landscape art piece. Our work included a variety of artist inspiration where we looked at colour, shape and mood to consider what would work well in our own individual pieces. The children have worked incredibly hard on these and are looking forward to showcasing these at our gallery.

In **English**, we have begun our core text 'The Tempest' delving into the world of Shakespeare. We have used the beginning of the text to identify the key characters and their relationship to one another. From this, we have explored the use of figurative language in the opening scene where Prospero conjures a storm. We used the storm scene to create personification sentences and our own poems called Prospero's Spell.

In Maths, JCA holiday tours have begun. Over the next few weeks, the children will be looking at holiday destinations and deciding on where their ideal holiday would be. This week, we have focused on using our statistic skills to help with our choices. We have needed to read and interpret climate and rainfall graphs and then research our own destinations to find a place we think we would enjoy! Next we will explore the distance and time it takes to get to our places using our conversion skills.



The Pupil Premium is extra government money which is paid to schools to support children's learning and development. We can support you in finding out if your child could receive the extra money. We can choose how to best spend the Pupil Premium money and will work with you to make sure your child benefits from the extra funding.

Who could benefit from this money?

Children from the reception year to year 6 may be eligible if they:

- are registered for Free School Meals (FSM)
- have been registered for FSM at any point in the last 6 years
- are or have been in care
- have parents in the armed forces *If your child could claim for FSM but takes a packed lunch to school, it's still important you tell us. This will let us know if your child is able to receive the Pupil Premium.

Your child could benefit from:

- exciting new learning activities and experiences
- one to one or small group sessions
- extra tools, materials and equipment to help with learning in school or at home
- before/after school clubs or activities

Why should I register my child for Free School Meals (FSM)?

Children who are registered for Free School Meals (FSM) are entitled to the Pupil Premium. Your child isn't automatically registered for FSM, even though all infant children are entitled to receive a free school meal.
